Patients have expressed satisfaction on the functioning of the PHC as the doctor is available and the services rendered was 24x7 for in door, outdoor and emergencies cases.

### 12. Observations/ Findings:

- Umden PHC is a delivery point with the number of delivery of 18-20 per month.
- The new labour room is completed.
- Construction of the new building is completed.
- There is a need for one more Doctors as the lone Dr J. Sohtun, MBBS, cannot manage with an average of 60 % patient daily.
- There is insufficient supply of Iron tablet (IFD), Folic Acid, Antacid etc.
- There is no X-Ray machine and Oxygen Cylinder,
- The electricity supply is also not connected to the building.
- At present the center has 14 beds & there is an urgent need of some more beds to accommodate patients.
- Cracks is visible in most of the rooms.

## 13. Suggestions :

The new building of the Umden PHC needs immediate electricity connection and water. Necessary equipments such as Oxygen Cylinder, X-ray machine may be equipped with. Medicines should be made available in sufficient quantity for the smooth functioning of the PHC.

## 12. Observations /Findings:

- The PHC lacks a 'Baby Corner' and a Counseling Room.
- The PHC has 12 beds.
- The Center has very less rooms to accommodate patients and there is no ante natal care as the same is done in the female ward
- Additional Staff Nurse and a Lab Technician is needed.
- Insufficient supply of Iron tablet (IFD), Folic Acid, Antacid etc.
- Ambulance is available but not in running condition.
- Leakages & cracks are visible in all quarters rooms.
- As reported people in the area demanded opening of private pharmacy as most of the patients prefer amoxylin injection instead of oral medicine in which a private pharmacy is opening up by the doctor near the centre.

13. Suggestions:

- The Marngar PHC requires construction of a baby corner and a counseling room.
- The PHC requires more rooms to accommodate patients as well as one room for ante natal care.
- New Ambulance is needed.

# 12. Observations/findings :

- The Doctor-in-charge was not available during inspection and only one Dr B. Challam, newly joined MBBS came when we were about to leave the centre.
- The services rendered in all the centres are supposed to be 24x7 for in door, out door and emergencies cases. It will be difficult for patients visiting the centre for medical treatment if doctors were not available.
- It was found out that the center is not well maintained and it lack cleanliness. There were foul smells everywhere we go in spite of having 12 casual cleaners.
- Medicines are not sufficient especially Folic acids, Iron (IFD) etc.
- What shocking is that, both males & females were accommodated in one male ward.
- 2 Radiant warmers and a Pediatric Suction Machine are out of order and one deep freezer is no longer working.
- An X-ray machine is available in the CHC but there is no technician. As such X-Ray tests cannot be done in the CHC.









- In some rooms there is problem with electricity as there are no plug points.
- Due to limited room accommodation, female patients were also accommodated in the children ward.
- The octoclave in the labour room is very old and 2 baby warmer machines are no more working. Sterilizing machine was not seen and old method of boiling water in the pots is <u>practiced using</u>.
- 13. Suggestions :
  - The authority concerned should look into the matter of cleanliness in the center.
  - A lab technician is required to operate the X-ray machine.
  - The two radiant warmers and a Pediatric machine needs to be fixed.
  - Perhaps all the above bottlenecks may be taken up by the concerned authority.
